Balance Sheet at March 31, 2020

• Balance sheet is in great shape. \$400k in cash, which is \$122k better than same point last year, and the only material liability is the USDA loan (which was at \$181k at the end of the Quarter, but is now at \$141k, due to the recent pay down).

Profit & Loss – Q1 Actuals vs. Budget

- Revenue was \$29k over budget, at \$172.8k vs. budget of \$143.7k.
 - Individual Contributions were \$15.4 under budget, as most March donations were designated for the Matching Campaign.
 - Fundraisers were \$49.9k over budget, as I budgeted 25% of the Matching Campaign donations to come in April.
 - Grants/Other were \$6k under budget. To date we have received grants from West America Bank \$1,250 and the Soroptimists \$1,000. We also have only received 2 Cal Fresh reimbursements to date.
- Expenses were \$10.8k under budget.
 - The bulk of the variances was Food which was \$9k under budget at \$61.4k for the Quarter. Placer Food Bank prices and Ray's buying prowess drive this.
 - Staff expense at \$24.3k was very close to budget of \$24.7k, a \$413 underrun.
 - Operations expenses are \$1.4k under budget of \$30.2k. Despite a \$3.9k unbudgeted refrigerator repair, underruns in Misc. expense, Fundraising expense, Trash Disposal and Utilities brought us in lower than budget.
- Net Revenue was \$56.9k or \$39.9 better than budget.
 - This is due to a combination revenue +\$29k to budget and expenses (\$10.8K) under budget.

Expected Trends:

- Q2 Revenue is expected to be better than budget. April to date is \$24k over budget, but the fundraiser concert, budgeted in May has been moved to October \$15k.
- Q2 expenses are expected to be near budget.

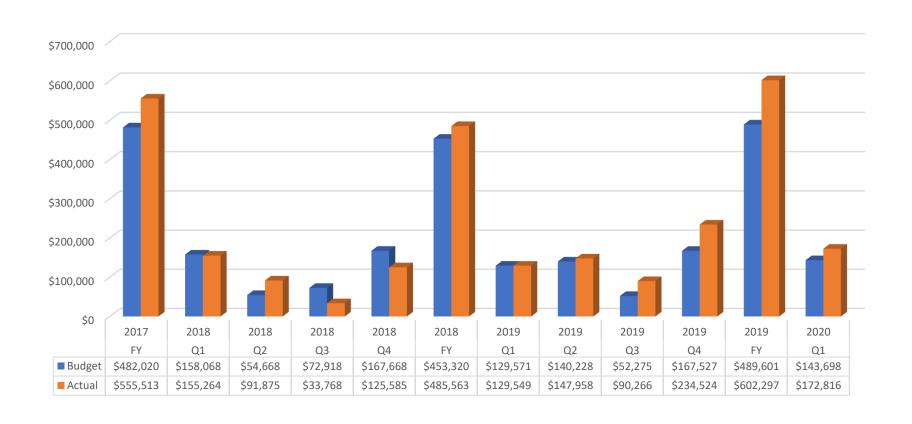
Q1 Cash Flow

- Cash Flow for Q1 was \$65.3k, driven by the overachievement in net operating revenue.
- The 2020 Budget forecasted negative cash flow of \$29.5k in Q1. The budget anticipated a \$40k loan paydown to the USDA, but the payment was not made until April. We delayed making the payment until the impact from the coronavirus on donations could be assessed.
- Q2 cash flow will reflect the USDA \$40k loan pay down.

Revenue Trends

- Revenue in Q1 is historically the 2nd highest quarter of the year. In 2017 & 2018 it was more than 30% of revenue for the year. The Budget calls for \$124.5k of revenue, or 22.2% of budget, in Q2.
- Individual Contributions are budgeted at \$67.2k in Q2.
- Fundraisers in Q2 include 25% of the expected Matching Campaign donations \$25k, and the Owens Shred Day \$3k. The Concert \$15k, budgeted in Q2, has been moved to October.
- Grant activity in the budget is low in Q2, with only United Way and Teichert in the budget.
