



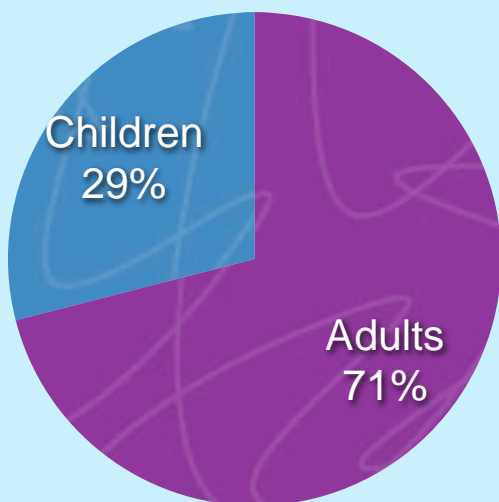
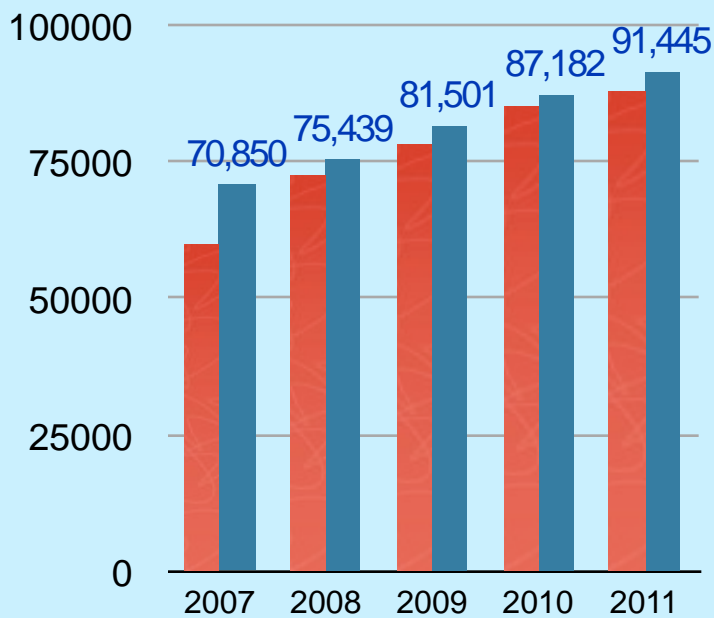

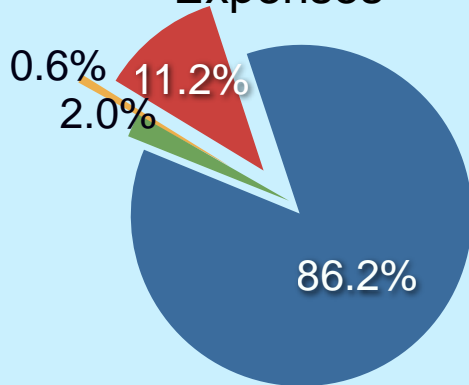
Donations: \$304,715 Up 7.5%

25 Years Serving the Hungry

Interfaith Food Ministry has been providing supplemental food as a 501(3)c non-profit in Western Nevada County since 1987. Over those 25 years 500,000 seniors, families with children, and single adults have walked through our doors.

But the genesis of IFM actually goes back to 1981 when Mary Chan went on a missionary trip to China, Hong Kong and the Philippines. She was very moved by the poverty that she saw and when she returned home to Grass Valley she felt the need to feed the poor in the community...feeling that "charity begins at home".

Thus Operation Blessings began. Mary and a few like-minded individuals rented a small house with St. Patrick's Church and Calvary Chapel paying the rent. A Board was formed and Mary was elected Director.

Mary and her team of volunteers collected produce and breadstuffs at Safeway and Lucky stores, even offering a free haircut program for awhile. There was also room for clothing and toys. They were open M-W-F until the food ran out. As need grew and word spread, they moved to an empty church on Main St. and then to a garage on S. Auburn, which evolved to form Interfaith Food Ministry in 1987.

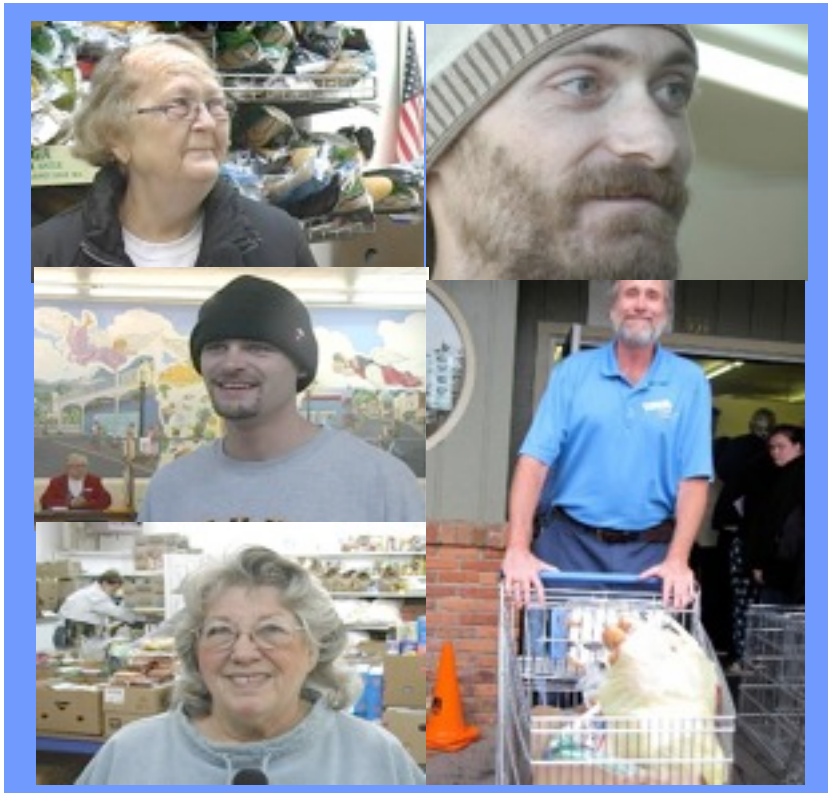


Operation Turkey

One in six Nevada County residents feel the **hurt of hunger**. And during the holidays the need and the desire to help is even greater. Like every year Operation Turkey has helped families make it through tough holiday times by providing a complete holiday meal with all the fix'ins in addition to their regular grocery pickup. 2011 brought the largest number of families ever... Thanksgiving 950 families and Christmas 850 families - Over 1800 meals served a family of four for just \$10 each for a total cost of \$18,000. Though our costs were higher than expected we were able to provide those meals through community support and by dipping into our reserves. We also offer a holiday meal at Easter which is not covered by the Operation Turkey fundraiser.

We expect 2012 food costs to be even higher and appreciate all that you do to provide food to the hungry.

Finally a special thank you to the Salvation Army who joined with us to shuttle clients from the Church of Christ to IFM. This helped tremendously with the traffic and parking.

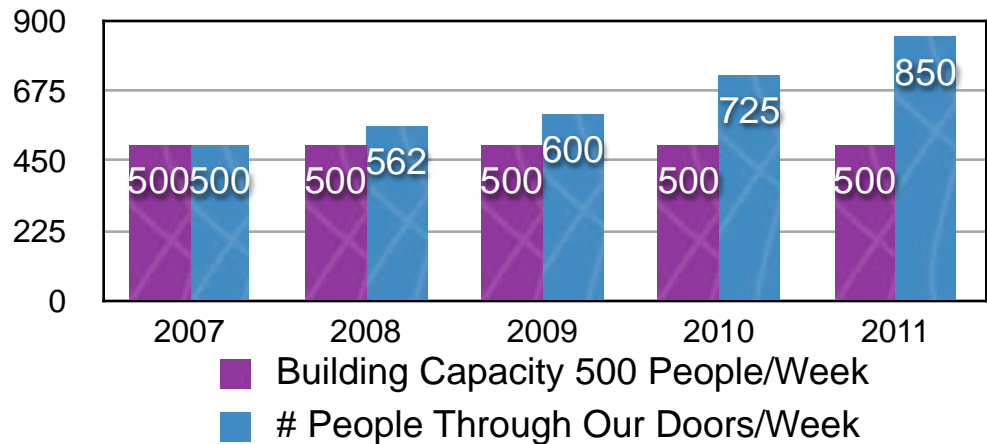
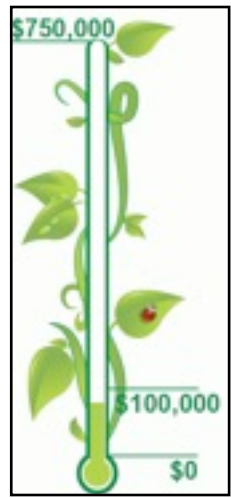

Looking Forward - Interfaith Food Ministry has launched its Partnering Against Hunger Campaign which, with your help, will double our capacity to serve the hungry in Western Nevada County.
