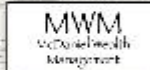

What's Next at IFM

We continue to focus on more nutritious foods with our now 2 gardens, purchasing of more protein, and exploring our client family needs.

We would also like to return to families being able to come every week for groceries instead of every other week. This would mean an approximate 40% increase in the number of families who walk through our doors on a M-W-F. In order to do this we need:

to refine our distribution system - We are working with distribution volunteers and supervisors trying to figure out how we can fill orders more quickly and accommodate more families.

more distribution volunteers - Please spread the word that we need people who can work, on a regular basis, M-W-F. They need to be able to stand from 8 am - 1 pm and work in a fast paced environment packing and sometimes lifting the weight of a bag of groceries. Those who are interested can fill out a volunteer application on our website www.interfaithfoodministry.org.

increase our financial contributions - Many of you already contribute financially and for this we are deeply grateful. We also consider your volunteer time priceless and know the time sacrifice made by over 400 of you is the backbone of IFM. Would you also consider making a financial commitment to IFM? A gift of just \$10 a month (or more) would go a long

way. With 400 volunteers that amounts to \$4000 a month or \$48,000 a year. This would be a significant amount of money and help us reach our goal of returning to once a week distribution.
